



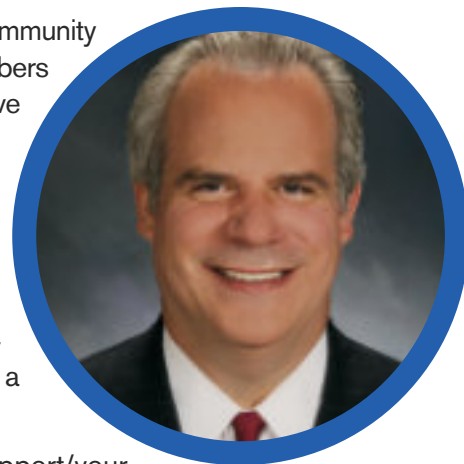

A Letter from Joe Manogue

Blessed are you for your dedication and support of our community neighbors in need! Your generous support allowed the members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul in North Texas to serve over 77,500 of our neighbors last year.

In addition to having over 800 of your neighbors who are active Vincentian volunteers, the Society in North Texas is also blessed to be able to create over 90 paid jobs to employ our incredibly talented and dedicated staff. Last year your Society in North Texas provided over \$34 million in aid to our Texan neighbors. These numbers are a testament to the tremendous impact of your support.



But they are only the beginning of your impact. Your support/your ministry allows our neighbors see the face of Christ giving hope and dignity to those we serve. Our Mini-Loan Program has made over 480 loans and will save our neighbors over \$2.6 million in excessively high loan interest costs and loan fees. Our Study Time program has provided close to \$1 million in scholarships to attend college preparatory schools and colleges. These scholarships allow our neighbors' children to obtain the education and skills to help lift their families out of the cycle of generational poverty! Your support has enabled our Charitable Pharmacy to not only keep people healthy enough to attend school or stay employed but also saves lives.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge and thank the incredible husband and wife team of Drs. Jeff and Mayra Thompson for partnering with the Society at our St. Vincent Center in Lancaster to start their St. Paul Charitable Medical Clinic in November. We are excited to be able to support the launch and growth of the St. Paul Medical Clinic!

Thank you to all that support our neighbors in need. I invite those who have not yet supported this special ministry to join us in raising up Your Ministry here in North Texas.

Blessed Frederic Ozanam

In 1833 Frederic Ozanam and a small band of his school friends formed the first Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul in Paris, France.

They were students at the Sorbonne and they had been challenged by some of their classmates “what are you doing for the poor?” Frederic and his confreres developed a plan to reach out to the poor in the community, visit them in pairs, to learn of their needs and then act to help them with food, clothing and other assistance.

Their inspiring path was replicated across France, and the Society grew rapidly. Members of the Society emigrated to St. Louis, Missouri in 1845 and established the first conference in the US at what is now the Basilica of St. Louis, King of France, affectionately known as “The Old Cathedral.” The Society came to North Texas with the establishment of the first conference in 1956 at Holy Trinity Parish.

Today in North Texas more than 800 volunteer members of the Society and the Diocesan Council are working to “Make Dreams Come True.” We want to share some of those dreams and how the Society is making them become real!

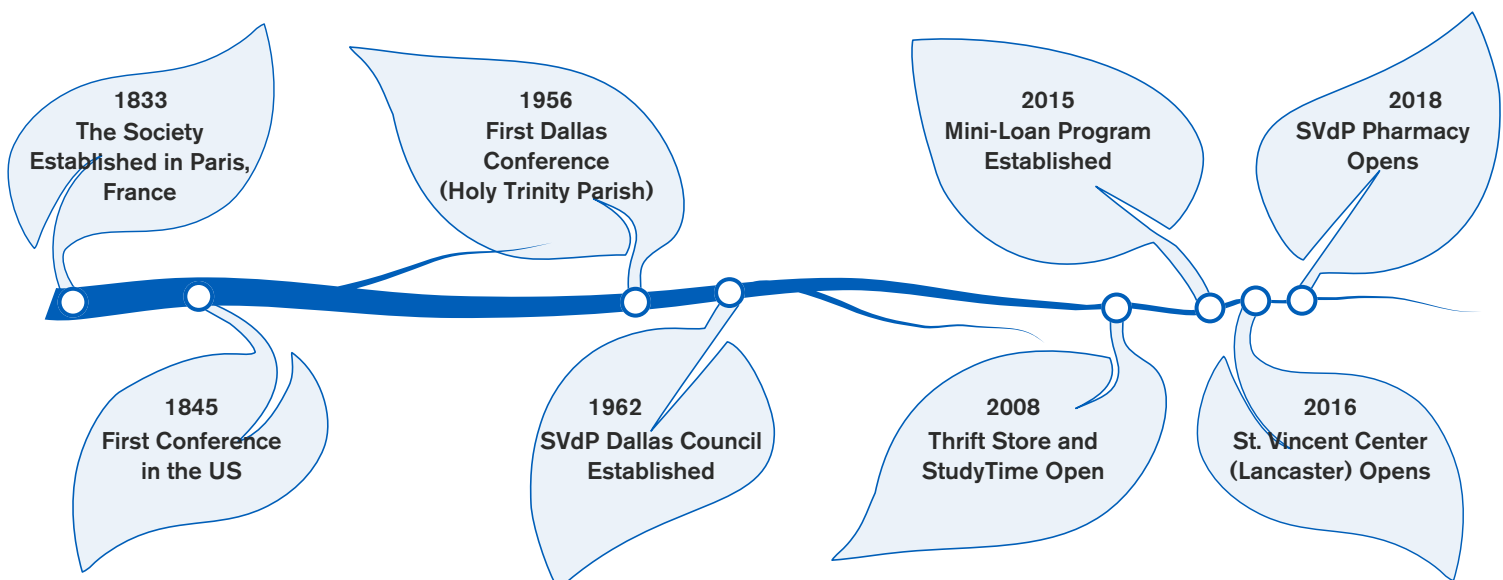

Life in a Conference

The Prince of Peace St Vincent de Paul Society, located in Plano, was commissioned in the Spring of 2021. This was in response to a call from our pastor, to better serve our neighbors in need. A notice in the bulletin invited parish members to attend a planning meeting, and more than 35 volunteers answered the call.

Our Prince of Peace Vincentians have responded wholeheartedly to our call for help and support. They have given the gift of time, treasure, and service. We believe that each of us was called out of our comfortable lives into a deeper walk with Christ in serving our sisters and brothers in need. We have heard the mandate of Jesus in Matthew 25: 31-46 and dedicated ourselves to living it out.

Our members meet twice a month, and our spiritual director leads us in prayer with scripture and reflection. Then we spend the remainder of our meeting discussing the ways to best assist our neighbors.

The support from our Prince of Peace community during our quarterly donation truck has been overwhelming. Our first event was so successful that we filled not just one truck but TWO! These donations of clothing, furniture and household goods go to the St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Stores. Thrift Store vouchers are then provided to our neighbors to shop free of charge, to fulfill their needs.

We also have volunteers that are bilingual and can assist neighbors that are Spanish speaking. Recently, we assisted a minister from Venezuela with clothing and furniture from the SVDP Thrift Store. This enabled him to gain employment. In appreciation, he gave our volunteer his worn bible and shared that it had been his rock during his long journey to the United States.

We also have given gift cards to families at Christmas. Additionally, we have provided dinners to the women and staff at Mater Filius, a home for expectant mothers.

In summary, our clergy and parishioners have been very supportive to our conference, and we, as advocates, have formed new friendships and worked side by side. We all agree that serving others in the Vincentian spirit has been truly transformational in our lives.

Vincentian Support



Being a member of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is a significant commitment on the part of every member. Vincentians are invited to grow in holiness, build new friendships in the Lord and to reach out in service of our neighbors in need.

The Vincentian Support team at the Diocesan Council for the Society of St. Vincent de Paul North Texas is here to provide resources and training to do just that, along with a multitude of other support functions to help our conferences throughout the diocese.

Working closely with our volunteer Formation Team, Vincentian Support hosts leadership training, home visit workshops and Ozanam Orientation to help educate, prepare, and enable Vincentians to serve their neighbors, their conferences and each other. Days of recollection and spiritual retreats are hosted to help members deepen their faith and grow in friendship and fellowship with the Lord and each other.

Additionally, the team coordinates our central help line, serving as the single point of contact via phone calls and emails for neighbors in need. The team coordinates these requests for assistance to the corresponding conference best equipped to help the neighbor and / or provide other resources for them to access.

Assisting our growing conferences is the third core component of our Vincentian Support team. Everything from coordinating quarterly and annual financial reporting, to managing Safe Environment training and validation, from answering functional and governance inquiries to administering the Emergency Assistance Fund for conferences. Our team is here to assist conferences in any way possible.

During the past year, four new parish conferences were formed: St. Ann in Kaufman; Corpus Christi in Ferris; Santa Clara in Dallas and Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Dallas. Each of these new Conferences were supported and trained by the Vincentian Support Team in both English and Spanish and are now part of our “network of friends” of 39 conferences across the Diocese of Dallas.



The Diocesan Council

The 39 Conferences of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul spread across the Diocese of Dallas are served by the small professional staff of the Diocesan Council of Dallas.

The Council operates five key programs: The St. Vincent de Paul Charitable Pharmacy; St. Vincent Center in Lancaster; Mini-Loan Program; StudyTime; and a Conference Emergency Fund, to provide financial support for conferences struggling to meet the needs of the neighbors who call upon their services.

The Council is led by a volunteer Board of Directors. The District Presidents (elected by the leadership of the Conferences within each district) elect the Council President, who then appoints other members of the Board.

The Pharmacy – Fulfilling the Dream of Healthier Living



For those people who do not have access to health insurance, medications are often a burden financially and emotionally.

Demetray is a perfect example. Demetray is a hard-working, industrious man, but he does not have health insurance. Last summer he was hospitalized with complications from heart issues and diabetes. When he returned to work he was faced with a dilemma. The medications that were prescribed cost hundreds of dollars a month, but his income didn't offer the option of paying for those medications, as well as paying rent and buying food. Demetray is the courier who picks up the packages of medications being shipped to patients across the State of Texas, so the St. Vincent de Paul Pharmacy became a part of his daily routine.

Christie Chavez, the pharmacy technician at the SVdP Pharmacy, heard Demetray's story and suggested that he apply for help getting his prescriptions from the Pharmacy. When he was approved, his doctors sent his prescriptions to the Pharmacy and now he receives his medications at no cost to him.

"I am so grateful to Christie and the entire St. Vincent de Paul team. I am doing better with my health, and I am doing better because I can take my medications according to the doctor's orders and not worry about how I will pay for them!"

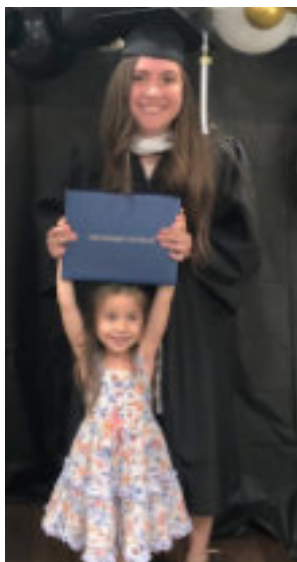


StudyTime – Dreaming of a Brighter Future

Parents dream that their children will have a better life than they have.

For many who struggle to make ends meet the pathway to a better life for their children is often through education.

That's where StudyTime can help. The tutoring program for children grades K-8 is helping those children prepare for secondary school. Here's the story of one family.



Maria emigrated to the United States at 19 years of age. Now she is the mother of nine children, and she and her husband have better lives than they had in Mexico. But she dreams for even better lives for her seven daughters and two sons. StudyTime has a major part in helping make those dream become reality.

Yesica is the oldest of the nine children. As she was preparing to enter high school from Santa Clara Academy she was encouraged to apply to Bishop Dunne High School. She received financial assistance, but it left a gap that her family could not afford. StudyTime offered her a scholarship to fill that gap. "My time at Bishop Dunne was transformative for me. I made great friends, did well in school and I was encouraged to apply to the University of Dallas for college."

Yesica graduated from UD in May 2023 with a degree in Psychology.

Yesica's young sister, Areli, followed in her footsteps. She also received a StudyTime scholarship to attend Bishop Dunne and has gone on to the University of Dallas, where she is studying Business and hopes to become an accountant.

Today, Yesica and Areli are both giving back to StudyTime, as part of the tutoring and mentoring team. And proud mother Maria said, "I am so grateful that my girls have been able to get a great education. We have been blessed by StudyTime!"



Mini-Loan Program – Securing Dreams for Financial Stability

Nichole Fisher first discovered the MLP program in Feb 2022 when she saw a story about the program on NBC 5. She went to the website and filled out an online screening form.

Nichole had taken out a title loan to repair roof damage to her South Dallas home after Snowmageddon in 2021. She had been paying on the loan for 10 months before she found us. She owed a little over \$2700.

She was approved for the loan through the Mini-Loan Program and was so happy to get that high interest loan paid off.

She completed both Financial Freedom Workshop classes in the early Summer of 2022.

She made 9 timely payments on the MLP loan when her car needed repair. She remembered that our financial coach told her about the emergency loan program so she called her to ask if she could possibly apply. She applied and was approved. She was able to roll in the loan balance on the original loan along with the car repair cost. The second loan was for \$2000. She has now paid off the second loan successfully.

Our loan coordinator met with Nichole to present her with the completion certificate and a \$50 deposit into her savings account. She was VERY happy.

Nichole has been able to save a little each month. She now has an emergency fund should she have a need in the future. She is on a road to financial recovery.



St. Vincent Center – Building a Community That Cares

Mr. and Mrs. Fernandez, a couple who live in Lancaster, are facing significant health challenges. They have been receiving support from St. Vincent Center and the community for the past two years.

Mr. Fernandez was diagnosed with kidney disease and is undergoing dialysis treatment, while Mrs. Fernandez has been diagnosed with breast cancer. These diagnoses have prevented them from being able to work, and their financial situation has become increasingly difficult.

Initially, Mr. Fernandez received sick pay from his job, which provided some relief. However, the payments eventually ceased, leaving the couple in a precarious position. Despite these hardships, the Fernandez family has not faced these challenges alone. Their children and the local church organization have come together to provide financial assistance during this trying time.

The Fernandez family are an integral part of the Lancaster community, and their selflessness and dedication to helping others have not gone unnoticed.



As faithful parishioners at St. Francis, they have actively supported the local St. Vincent de Paul Conference and its utility assistance program. Their commitment to giving back and their unwavering strength in the face of adversity are truly inspiring.

We, as a community, are grateful for the opportunity to support the Fernandez family during this challenging time. Their resilience and determination serve as a reminder of the power of unity and compassion. We encourage everyone to come together and extend a helping hand to those in need.

When you light a lamp . . .



For too many years the work of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul of North Texas has been “the best kept secret in Dallas.”

However the Diocesan Council has chosen to spread the Good News of the works of the Society here in Dallas and beyond.

With the help of Westphall PR, a dynamic media and public relations firm, the Diocesan Council has been sharing our story and inspiring people far and wide.

WFAA-TV, the local ABC affiliate, has made Luis Gonzalez, CEO of the Diocesan Council, a “regular” guest on Good Morning Texas to speak about the works of the Society, especially the Charitable Pharmacy. We have attracted coverage from all the local TV networks and had multiple appearances in local print and radio, including *The Texas Catholic*, *D CEO* magazine, KRLD, Guadalupe Radio Network and the *Dallas Morning News*.

In November, the pharmacy was the host site for *The BeatiDudes*, a weekly podcast for Christian men seeking to do God’s will while growing together in humor and holiness. They featured the Pharmacy as an example of people caring for the poor.

The cover photo of this Annual Report is taken from a news report on the SVdP Charitable Pharmacy’s partnership with Haven of Hope, a program for people struggling with homelessness in San Antonio. Olivia is “jumping for joy” because she has been taking medication regularly for mental illness and her new-found stability led to her securing a new job! All because the Pharmacy provided medication to someone who had no health insurance and she changed her life!



SVdP Thrift Stores – Making Dreams Come True, One Small Item at a Time!

Each autumn the Thrift Store hosts a Thanksgiving feast give-away. Each conference is invited to share the story of one family in need, and we bring a full meal plus groceries for a week, and a gift certificate to Walmart or another local store.

One November during the annual Thanksgiving Dinner Giveaway our store team visited the winning neighbor to drop off their winnings. The prize is a full spread of groceries for the perfect Thanksgiving dinner, including enough groceries for a week (eggs, milk, a 35lb turkey, potatoes, corn etc.) In addition, this prize included a small gift card.

Our visit to our neighbor's home revealed a much greater need for assistance than just food. We noticed that the family of four was sharing one bed, a very small couch, and that their infant child was sleeping inside of a grocery cart with a small mattress inside of it.

We knew we needed to help them with more than just food, so our team returned to the store and found a crib from the donations department, got the rest of the store team to donate to buy a brand new crib mattress and returned to give this to the family.

In addition, we had our manager increase the donation amount for grocery funds to an extra \$100 and the family was beyond happy that we went above and beyond to do this for them.

The mother gave each of our team members a large hug and thanked everyone for our kindness. This neighbor went on to become a frequent shopper of St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store.

South Central Regional Meeting

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is an international community of lay men and women who seek to grow in their relationship with God in a community of like-minded people who then go out to serve the most vulnerable and the struggling in their communities.

In the United States there are 154 (Arch)Diocesan Councils with over 90,000 members. The Diocesan Councils are clustered in nine regional groupings. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul of North Texas is part of the South Central Region, which is comprised of the states of Louisiana and Texas.

Each region holds an annual gathering of members to inspire and further engage Vincentians at all levels of the Society. In 2024 the South Central Regional Meeting will be held at the Omni Las Colina in Las Colinas in June and will be hosted by The Society of St. Vincent de Paul of North Texas. The theme of this year's regional meeting is "Removing the Veil," encouraging attendees to open their hearts, minds and eyes to the future.

Most importantly, Vincentians at all levels of the Society will have the opportunity to talk about the future of the Society, the challenges we face and the hope for the future as we listen to one another.

Spark of Hope Breakfast

Each spring The Society of St. Vincent de Paul of North Texas hosts the Spark of Hope Breakfast. Originally begun to support the StudyTime Program, the breakfast has shifted to supporting all the programs of the Diocesan Council. For several years the Spark of Hope Breakfast was held at the Park Cities Club, a 17th Floor venue with a spectacular view of Dallas.

In 2022 the Spark of Hope Awards were initiated to honor individuals, families or organizations that make a difference for each of the programs: The Charitable Pharmacy, St. Vincent Center, the Mini-Loan Program and Study Time.

In 2023 the honorees were:

- Richard Kelly for his generous support of the Pharmacy;
- Kenneth Govan, of Oncor, for his leadership with Neighborhood of Hope at St. Vincent Center;
- Anita Mirro, from Inwood Bank, for her partnership with the Mini-Loan Program; and
- Carol Ruggeri as one of the founding volunteers of the StudyTime Program.

Our featured speaker was Bishop John Quinn, retired Bishop of Rochester-Winona in Minnesota. Bishop Quinn had served as the National Spiritual Advisor to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and currently serves as the Spiritual Advisor to the National Foundation Board. His message was “look for God’s hand at work in unexpected places – you never know when the good that you do will have an impact on others!”

The breakfast attracted more than 145 attendees – the largest breakfast to date – and raised nearly \$60,000 for the works of the Diocesan Council.







Preparing Students for a New School Year

One of the traditions of “Back-to-School” time is to outfit students with a backpack and school supplies. Go to any Walmart, Office Depot or Staples and you will find parents collecting the supplies and backpacks their children will need for the upcoming school year.

But for many parents who struggle to make ends meet, this exercise in preparing for a new school year is unaffordable.

For many years the Society of St. Vincent de Paul Diocesan Council, through its programs at St. Vincent Center in Lancaster and StudyTime, has been providing hundreds of backpacks to low-income families that we serve. Over the past several years backpacks have been shared with the local parish conferences for them to provide to their neighbors.

Under the leadership of Cindy Estrada (Vincenitian Support Leader) and Melani Guerra (Director of StudyTime) we were able to acquire nearly 1,000 backpacks of varying designs and an equal number of supply kits. In mid-July a team of youth volunteers gathered at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish to sort the backpacks, fill them with the school supply kits and pack them for distribution. On the following Saturday morning, volunteers distributed the backpacks to the conferences and to individual families at several locations (St. Vincent Center in Lancaster, Holy Trinity Parish in Dallas and John Paul II High School in Plano).

The collaborative effort between Council staff, Conferences and volunteers makes a real difference for a families who cannot afford to send their children to school with a new backpack and school supplies.



Playing Santa Claus for Hundreds of Needy Families

One of the key ways that Vincentians offer help to our neighbors is to ensure that their children are cared for.

Each Christmas our conferences and the Diocesan Council collect Christmas gifts for children and families, so that on Christmas morning those children can share in the joy of Christmas.

The effort includes hundreds of volunteers to purchase, sort and distribute several thousand gifts. While there is so much to do to make it all happen, it is a “labor of love” that is fulfilled by the experience of seeing the faces of families as they are presented their gifts.

At our Council offices, located at Holy Trinity Parish, the 70+ families of StudyTime received their gifts and had a visit with Santa Claus. One mother shared, “I am so grateful to St. Vincent de Paul for the help they offer. I can’t afford much in the way of Christmas gifts, so the support you offer is a great help! Thank you!”



St. Vincent Center in Lancaster is also a hub of Christmas activity, with several hundred families seeking help, including Christmas presents, holiday foods and other items.
