Our Story

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul began in a college debate in Paris, France. In 1833, Frédéric Ozanam, a 20 year old student, was asked what he and his fellow Catholic students were doing personally to help the poor in Paris. Taking the question to heart, Ozanam and six of his peers formed

the first "Conference of Charity" on April 23, 1833.

This group visited the poor in their homes, providing them with needed aid and assistance. Ozanam adopted the name of The Society of St. Vincent de Paul in honor of their patron saint, who had dedicated his life to serving the poor in 16th Century France.

Within a few years, the original group grew to over 2,000 members and spread to 15 other cities and towns in France. Today, the Society has a presence in almost every country in the world and over a million volunteers.

Neighbors Helping Neighbors

We Serve Those in Need:

The Society offers both short-term crisis relief and longterm assistance to those who call. Below are a few of the ways we help neighbors in need in our communities.

Emergency Aid

Vincentians make thousands of home visits every year in order to experience first-hand every person's situation and to evaluate their needs at an individual level. We provide rent and utility assistance, food and hygiene products through our local parish conferences. We also provide referrals to other groups that can help. Most importantly, we make a compassionate offer of friendship to those we meet.

Systemic Change

Our regional systemic change programs address the root causes of poverty and empower our neighbors to transform their lives.

- SVdP Pharmacy: provides free prescription medication for those without insurance
- •MiniLoan Program: offers payday loan refinancing, payday loan alternatives, financial coaching and budgeting support for 1 year
- StudyTime provides after school tutoring and academic support for K-8 students and their families

National Programs

National Society programs like House-in-a-box provides basic household furnishings to those who have lost their homes to disaster. In addition, our Back2School program provides backpacks filled with school supplies, coupons and access to discounted clothing and uniforms

Thrift Stores

Proceeds from our Thrift Stores support the ability for conferences to give financial aid, and fund our regional programs.
